Super full-flavoured, tropical fruits, guava with a delicate spice, good concentration and high acidity, a zippy estate wine. Energetic and with all the structure for a long and happy life.

A wine for seafood; dry and refreshing with complex layers. This beautiful wine has subtle notes of rose petal, lemon, nettle and grapefruit.

Our Vineyard Manager, Jon Pollard, suggests that the success of 2014 was a combination of nature and meticulous nurture. "Veraison was about ten days ahead of normal, and it was a smaller crop than in previous years. This was partly due to weather conditions at fruit set, but also a result of deliberately dropping around 20% of selected bunches in the vineyard. By reducing the quantity of grapes left on the vine, we boosted the remaining fruit's concentration and ripeness.

Our Chief Winemaker, Charlie Holland, believes 2014 was a watershed moment. "2014 convinced me that our wonderfully unique blend of soils and climates could consistently create outstanding ripeness. The fruit was perfectly ripe and we found more pronounced stone and orchard fruit flavours alongside the typical English citrus fruit. A harmonious blend of perfect natural acidity and sugars was achieved effortlessly. No fining or intervention was required. We simply focused on producing the best quality possible and let the fruit express itself."

### Pétrus 2006 - Pomerol, Bordeaux, France

£4000.00

One of the world's rarest wines, Petrus has truly become an icon of its time under Christian Moueix. The vineyard of just 11½ hectares is located on a plateau in the highest part of Pomerol, the Merlot vines flourishing in the famous blue clay soils. The vines are planted for no less than 70 years, giving extraordinary concentration within the fruit. The grapes are harvested by hand, only in the afternoons when all dew has evaporated in order not to risk any dilution to this intense concentration. The wines are considered approachable after 10 years in bottle: the 2006 vintage is now drinking exceptionally well.

### Sassicaia 1996, Tenuta San Guido - Tuscany, Italy

Sassicaia is today one of the world's most sought-after wines. Mario Incisa della Rocchetta began planting the Bordeaux varieties Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc and Merlot in Bolgheri on the Tuscan coast, an area of land that had previously been thought to be unsuitable for growing vines. Within the deeply conservative 1960's Tuscan wine-making world this was a radical, even inflammatory, move. So was born the first Super Tuscan. The name Sassicaia means "place of many stones" and the gravel soils have been compared to those of Medoc. Regarded now as one of the world's greatest Cabernet Sauvignon wines, Sassicaia recently made history by being the first single wine to be granted its own DOC. The wines of Sassicaia combine intense notes of cassis and cedar, with extraordinary power and length.

### Hermitage La Chapelle 2009, Paul Jaboulet Aîné - Rhône, France

Returning from the crusades in the 13th century, the knight Gaspard de Sterimberg sought a new life of peace and solitude. He built a chapel overlooking the Rhône valley and lived the remainder of his days as a hermit. Thus the Hermitage appellation can trace its roots. Today, the greatest proponent of Hermitage wine for the past 50 years, Paul Jaboulet Aîné, is still producing small quantities of this famous wine, practising at the highest end of his art. Small quantities of Syrah grapes are harvested by hand before being brought down the steep slopes of the valley, carried by sledge to the winery. Using only traditional methods, spending up to 18 months on new French oak, these wines are very deep in colour, magnificently and hauntingly savoury. The quintessential Syrah.

### Tignanello 2014, Marchesi Antinori - Tuscany, Italy

Antinori is the most famous name in Italian wine and the influence of Piero Antinori in the last 25 years has been nothing short of revolutionary. It's a fair statement to say they created the first Super Tuscan. Antinori's flagship wine, Tignanello, first appeared in 1971 and caused a sensation by its use of Cabernet Sauvignon in a Sangiovese blend and with its practice of ageing in small French barriques. Antinori was accused of vinous treachery and treason but soon barrique-aged blends of Sangiovese and Cabernet began appearing all across Tuscany. The Sangiovese dominates on the nose with notes of grilled meats and Morello cherries. These are echoed on the palate, reminiscent of great Chianti Classico, before the blackcurrant comes in towards the finish to remind you that the Cabernets are there. Great acidity and full, but soft tannins indicate that this will drink relatively early, but has at least a decade of life ahead of it. Another delicious Tig' from the team at Antinori.

### Château Palmer 3eme Cru Classe 1989 - Margaux, Bordeaux, France

Dating back to the 17th century, Chateau Palmer took its name from Englishman Charles Palmer who purchased the Estate in 1814. The 66 hectare property is now owned by two Bordeaux négociant families – Sichel and Mähler-Besse, under the charismatic leadership of oenologist Thomas Duroux. Situated not far from the village of Margaux, the vines grow overlooking the Gironde Estuary in a mixture of gravel, sand and clay soils. Since 2008 the estate has become fully biodynamic and the wines share their home with grazing animals and complementary plants. 1989 is one of the great vintages of Château Palmer, a perfectly balanced and exquisitely detailed blend of 52% Cabernet Sauvignon, 41% Merlot, 6% Petit Verdot and 1% Cabernet Franc. It is a wine that can be described as cerebral. The wines are fleshy, full-bodied and powerful yet supple. The tannins are ripe and integrated.

### Ridge Geyserville 2019 - Alexander Valley, USA

£195.00

Ridge vineyards have been the darlings of critical praise for decades. They were some of the first to champion old-vine Zinfandel, making it since 1964. Some of the vines behind this Zinfandel dominated blend are over 130 years old. This is rich and juicy, and you can expect intense notes of black cherry, oak spice, cola, mint and blackcurrant.

# Iconic & Exceptional

## Grands-Echezeaux Cru 2017, Joseph Drouhin -Côte de Nuits, Burgundy, France

The name comes from "cheza" (plural "chezeaux"): a hamlet. The monks of Cîteaux, who already owned Clos Vougeot, coveted the Musigny vineyard but were never able to acquire it. They put all their hopes instead on Grands-Echezeaux so as to become the rival of the prestigious Musigny. Peerless Burgundy, packed with cherries, dark chocolate and cocoa bean, increasingly fragrant with truffle, undergrowth and leather as it ages.

## Opus One 2007, Robert Mondavi - Napa Valley, USA

Opus One began as a collaboration between the great Californian winemaker Robert Mondavi and Baron Phillipe de Rothschild, the first vintage of 1979 being released in 1983. The vines are to be found in dense proliferation around the state of the art winery in Oakville. A Cabernet Sauvignon/Merlot blend on a 95:5 split, the wine is stored on new French oak for 18 months before spending another 18 months in bottle prior to release. Opus One is one of California's most high profile wines. It is also one of its best. The 2007 is regarded by commentators and critics as being one of the greatest wines ever made at Opus One. The flavours of blackcurrant and liquorice shine through, but there is also an undercurrent of subtle smokiness. Running alongside, an opulent texture and dazzling purity mark this out as one of Mondavi's great vintages.

## Dominus 2005 - Napa Valley, USA

The reputation of Christian Moueix as one of the world's leading winemakers is based as much on the wines of Dominus as Petrus. His longstanding relationship with the West Coast began in the 1960s as a student studying abroad. Despite returning home to run the family vineyards in Bordeaux, his affection for Napa was undimmed, returning to take full control over the famous Napanook vineyard in the mid-Nineties. The 2005 is a classic Bordeaux blend of 92% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Cabernet Franc and 3% Petit Verdot. This is the blessed union of French savoir faire and Napa fruit purity. Powerful flavours of earth, blackcurrant, sweet black cherry and incense, with the oak firmly pushed into the background, are the rewards of this great "Terroir" wine which is now hitting its prime.

## Cheval des Andes 2012 - Mendoza, Argentina

Often referred to as a 'New World Grand Cru', it's described as the best of both worlds: a combination of the intensity of Argentinian fruit but dressed in a very elegant way with that French style. A collaboration between Terrazas de los Andes and Pierre Lurton of Cheval Blanc. A warmer vintage but they harvested earlier to preserve the freshness. The 2012 Cheval des Andes has more floral notes of violets and lilies.

### Trimbach Cuvée Frédéric Emilé Riesling 1983 - Alsace, France

Earning a listing for one of your wines at a Michelin-starred restaurant is a proud moment – so what must it be like to be featured by every single three Michelin-starred restaurant in France (that's 27 in total)? It's an accolade that reflects the historic excellence and purist vision of F. E. Trimbach, unquestionably one of the great names of Alsace and a family business that can trace its origins all the way back to 1626. A complex nose of white bread crust, toasted bread, dried apricots and spices. There's also pepper on the nose and palate that makes the wine more concentrated and hot. A nice, mature, concentrated dry white wine. There's a side of lively, sweet fruity notes to this wine as well.

### Château d'Yquem, Sauternes Premier Grand Cru - Bordeaux, France

£200.00

Yquem is located on the highest hill in Sauternes and enjoys the best growing conditions in the whole appellation. The 110-hectare vineyard is planted with 80% Sémillon and 20% Sauvignon Blanc. Only fully botrytized fruit is picked by the 150 highly skilled pickers and yields are so low that each vine produces only one glass of wine. Yquem is fermented in oak barrels (100% new) and is left in barriques to mature for up to 36 months. Intensely opulent when young, Yquem develops an extraordinary complexity and exotic richness when fully mature, with the best vintages lasting for over 50 years. With a refined fragrance of honeysuckle, citrus peel, and barley sugar, this has very elegant sweetness on the palate but it is not at all blowsy, with good acidity to provide excellent balancing freshness. Beautifully harmonious and truly fine, with a very long finish.

### 181 Taylor's 1977 - Douro, Portugal

Fresh nose, clean fruit with delicate floral notes. A wine with great complexity of fruit – berry and spice, dense, luscious and concentrated, yet with a soft, delicate finish which belies the inner strength.

### 179 Taylor's 1980 - Douro, Portugal

Ruby, cherry red tones gently fading at edges. Attractive fresh fruit and spice bouquet. Intense; surprisingly youthful. An elegant, nicely weighted and balanced wine. Firm full fruit flavours with a freshness that carries on through to the finish..

### 178 Taylor's 1985 - Douro, Portugal

Intense ruby colour, now just beginning to open out. Rich, complete, multidimensional nose, displaying elements of both youth and maturity. Aromas of ripe berry fruit, liquorice and butterscotch with scented violet notes. The palate is now quite smooth and round with velvety well integrated tannins and masses of rich figgy fruit flavour. Warm mellow finish full of rich jammy fruit.

### 182 Taylor's 1997 - Douro, Portugal

Made in one of the best vintages for port in the 1990s. Black purple; opaque. Dense, tight, rich full fruit nose. Cedar and dark berry aromas. A big, full bodied wine with great finesse and style. Great character and potential.
