

Walk to Edgemoor Inn Edge village

The walk from the hotel is pretty straightforward to start with as it follows the main road towards **Stroud**. Sturdy walking shoes are essential or wellies especially so on a rainy day. During the summer, take a bottle of water refresh you, as the road is steep.

Shortly after the retirement village of Painswick, you will notice a small **bench** next to the curve of the road which is a great spot to catch a breather to and back from your walk.

While on the main road, is best to keep on the left-hand side because there is a consistent pedestrian path. There is no footpath on the right side of the road which can often be quite dangerous with the oncoming traffic.

At some point the road will split into two and to your right there will be an uphill lane with a sign for **Pitchcombe** just before it. If you are using some sort of navigation, the name of the lane is **Jenkin's Lane**. A few minutes after your turn, you'll see why wellies are important as the road gets a bit narrow and muddy.

To your left and right you might just encounter some woolly friends of George, so say hello and "Baa" for good measure!

The best place for a selfie will be just next to **The Jenkin's House**. Presumably the road you are on was named after that family. For nature lovers, there are 2-3 stops further down where you are surrounded by nature, also great spots for photos.

Bear in mind that the road becomes narrow and if you encounter a vehicle, there's not many mud-free spots to stop and let them pass. If you are going by car, you might need to reverse until you find one of the two passing spots wide enough for both cars. The mentioned spots are roughly 10 and 3 minutes away from the Edgemoor Inn.

When you reach the Edgemoor Inn, rest assured that the car park is quite large! If you're on foot, it will help you locate the entrance which is straight through from the car park.

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The Edgemoor Inn is a 19th century inn located in the small village of Edge, overlooking the beauty of the Painswick Valley. It's a stunning backdrop to enjoy a delicious home cooked meal at a traditional Cotswolds inn.

There is also a large terraced patio overlooking the valley which is a great place to enjoy a drink or two on a summer evening. Depending on the weather, you have the option of sitting outside and enjoying the spectacular view... or inside on the cosy sofas and tables. Since the pub is very accommodating in size, they can easily accept tables of up to 10 people and more. For such large parties, it's advisable to call them and book in advance.

The pub is open from 11:30am (in winter the opening times may wary so check online just to make sure). Food is served from 12 noon onwards with many dishes to choose from including vegaetarian options. Prices are reasonable.

Walking back to the hotel is downhill and at dusk the view is beautiful. If you like, when you reach Painswick centre you can cut through **Saint Mary's churchyard** by taking the path which goes right by the entrance.

Edgemoor Inn opening times:

Sunday: 12 noon - 10:30pm

Due to high demand and popularity, it's advisable to book a table for for lunch or dinner.

Again, we can't stress enough that if you're walking there or back, it does get slippery, so sturdy footwear is essential!

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
